- i. A Muellerian Duct Cyst in a Male - Dr. Emerson Smith, Montreal;

Abst: A case of Muellerian duct cyst in a male is reported. This is one of the rarer congenital anomalies. It originates in the sinus pocularis of the prostate. Clinically it closely simulates prostatism with acute retention. Total excision of cyst is ideal treatment.

- iii. Dysfunction of the Bladder - Surg. Lieut. Cmdr. David R. Mitchell,

Abst: The body of the paper deals with deranged function of the bladder in Service personnel without any of the usual findings being present that cause symptoms, such as frequency, urgency, incontinence and enuresis. The investigation and treatment of these patients is discussed and illustrated by lantern slides. Cystometrographic charts have been prepared of bladder reflexes in patients with known neurological lesions to round out the presentation.

- i. The Suppression of Urine due to Giant Hydronephrosis. A Case Report with Discussion - Dr. Walter Hogarth, Ft. William

Abst: Man with anuria for forty eight hours due to massive right hydronephrosis treatment after failure of medical treatment. Nephrotomy left kidney followed by right nephrectomy and recovery.

- ii. History of French Urology - Dr. J. P. Bourque, Montreal

- iii. Repair of War Wounds to the Bulbous and Membranous Urethra, with the Use of Skin Grafts and Penicillin - Surg. Lt. Cmdr. John T. Maclean, R.C.N.V.R., Ste. Anne de Bellevue; Dr. John Gerrie, Montreal

Abst: Repair of war wounds to the bulbous and membranous urethra may be either early or late. The treatment in late cases is totally different to that of a new wound. An endeavour was made to ascertain if good results could be obtained in late cases by a combination of well known surgical techniques. The repair of the urethra was carried out with split thickness skin grafts built up on a catheter and inserted into the defect in the urethra. Penicillin was given. Healing was per primum. This work is presented as a preliminary investigation into the possibilities of developing a standard procedure. It has been carried on at the Montreal Military Hospital, Montreal, and the D.V.A. Hospital, Ste. Anne de Bellevue.

- iv. Prostatitis on the North Atlantic Service - Surg. Lieutenant W. E. Collins, R.C.N.V.R., St. John's

Abst: In this area, the incidence of non-specific prostatitis is high and the severity of symptoms is marked. A review of 120 cases, with an analysis of the etiological factors involved, the bacteriology, diagnosis, associated lesions, symptomatology and the response to various types of treatment is presented.

- v. Penicillin in Gonococcal Infection - Dr. Lucien Sylvestre, Montreal

Abst: The first part of the present article is a review of our experience in the management of gonorrhoea with penicillin in hospitalized patients. A total of 300 cases which were treated as in-patients are described.

Our second group is made up of patients who received schemes of treatment that do not necessitate hospitalization.

Penicillin in sterile saline solution, penicillin in oil - and results of oral administration of penicillin will all be studied and we hope will be a subject for general discussion.

i. Treatment of Cystine Calculi - Dr. C. A. Cawker, Montreal

Abst: A review of the literature and a summary of five cases of Cystine Renal Calculi with clinical test for cystinuria and treatment.

ii. Treatment with Vitamin B of a Special Type of Vesical Atony -
Dr. Norman W. Roome, Toronto

Abst: Three cases of neurogenic vesical atony are described in which the atony was presumably due to avitaminosis B, and in which large doses of thiamin chloride and/or other B vitamins resulted in spectacular improvement.

iii. Mortality in Prostatic Adenoma - Dr. S. A. MacDonald, Montreal

Abst: A critical review of the causes of death in prostatic surgery with an analysis of 500 consecutive cases. Discussion of present day trends in treatment.

iv. Management of the Neurogenic Bladder in Spinal Cord Injury -
Major David Swartz, R.C.A.M.C., Winnipeg

Abst: Paper is based upon a study of 30 cases, most of whom have returned from broed with supra-pubic tubes. These are classified according to site and completeness of lesion. A system of treatment is outlined in which tidal irrigation with cystometric control plays a prominent part. Urinary complications are noted and possible end results discussed.
