Dear Colleague:



Morning sessions will be held from Monday to Thursday. In addition, afternoon meetings have been included to provide pediatric, research and resident forums.

We are anxious that as many residents as possible will be present to attend a panel discussion on « Post Graduate Education ». The Association will sponsor a dinner for the residents and their wives during the meeting in addition to the annual banquet.

Arrangements for the programme are almost complete. The symposium on « Some Aspects of Paraplegia » will feature Dr. W. Geisler from Lyndhurst Lodge; Mr. J. J. Fenimore Cooper joining Dr. Victor Marshall, Dr. C. J. Robson, Dr. W. K. Kerr and Dr. W. Staubitz in the presentations. There have been many fine submissions from the membership at large, and the final composition of the programme will be forwarded to you.

The social programme is developing and it is hoped to have a dinner and theatre evening on Monday. The ladies' committee under the direction of Mrs. C. J. Robson is planning an attractive programme for the wives.

Your executive met in Vancouver in January.
