The second meeting of the Section of Urology was held in Vancouver, June 24th, 1931. This section met apart from the General Session in the Wedgewood Room of the Vancouver Hotel. A few members were present from the East, more from the Prairie Provinces and most from the cities of the Pacific Coast. There were also present a number of urologists from the Pacific Coast States. The attendance was about 75.

The two papers of interest to the paediatricians attracted a number of doctors interested in that specialty, including Dr. H. F. Helmholtz whose discussion was deeply appreciated.

At the close of the session a business meeting was held. Dr. Robin Pearse was elected President and Dr. J. C. McClelland Secretary. After the meeting the members adjourned for luncheon given by the local urologists.

DISCUSSION:

Dr. McEachern in his paper demonstrated clearly

the importance of a complete and thorough examination in all conditions affecting the urinary apparatus of infants and children. The Pyelograms shown by him revealed very definitely their value in the cases presented.

The case presented by Dr. Emerson Smith showed a careful history and a scientific working out of the diagnosis and treatment. Treatment was discussed by many including Dr. Hemholz.

Dr. Robin Pearse stressed the value of early recognition of Bladder Tumours giving a clear and honest opinion as to his treatment and results in a series of cases.

The paper of Dr. F. Patch on Peritoneal adhesions demonstrated that they may affect the urinary tract and the advisability of recognising this fact. This was well shown by a number of pyelograms.

The symposium by Drs. Ritchie and Patch was of great interest both to the radiologists as well as to the urologists present. Many beautiful pyelograms were shown demonstrating both the intravenous and retrograde methods. Each has its value in the diagnosis of urological lesions.
